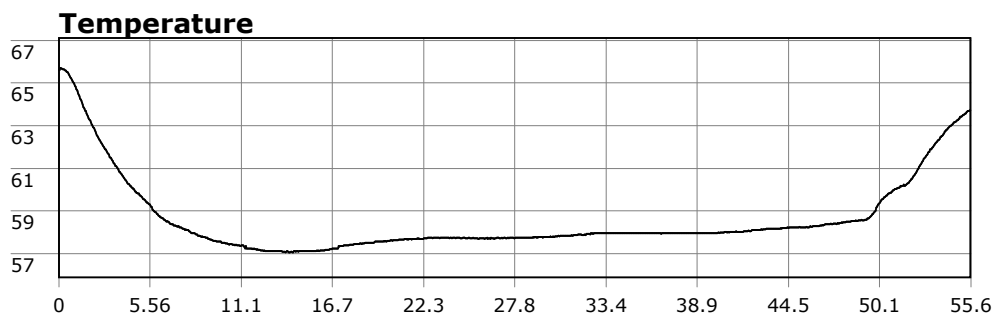

## Comments

10 Aug 08

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; small light; 14lbs weight; no camera and no pony bottle.

Second dive at OML first time at the point. Conditions were calm with only the occasional breaker. This go around we went to the Point. Chris and Bob gave me some do's and don'ts in a prebrief and had me go in the middle should I need bailing out from the rocks. Entry was unevenful; and we kicked out, solidified our dive plan, and dropped down. We were on the statue in just a few minutes. Vis was clear up to 8-10 ft with an outer limit of 15ft.

We did the usual profile used at the Point of hanging out at the point for a bit then swimming for the cove underwater. There was a mild current (wrong direction of course) in spots, but the kick in was generally an easy do.

Plenty of wildlife on this dive to include sheephead (all females), nudibranchs, spanish shawls, starfish, senioritas, greenlings, rockfish, and perch. Once we got to the cove, we had some air to burn; so Bob busted up some urchins, and we enjoyed the feeding frenzy. All in all a very good dive.
