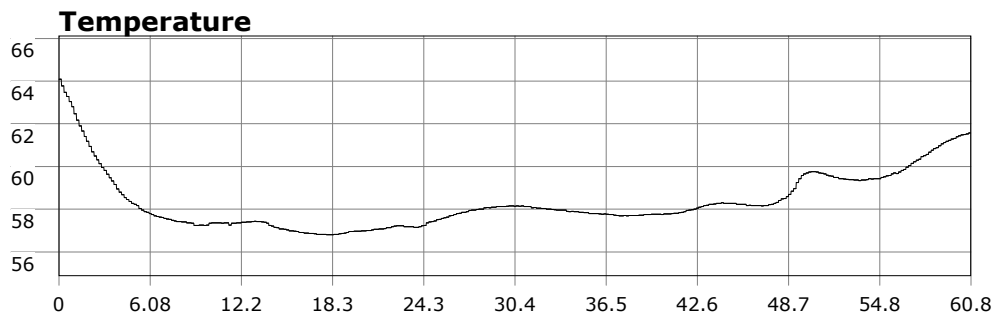
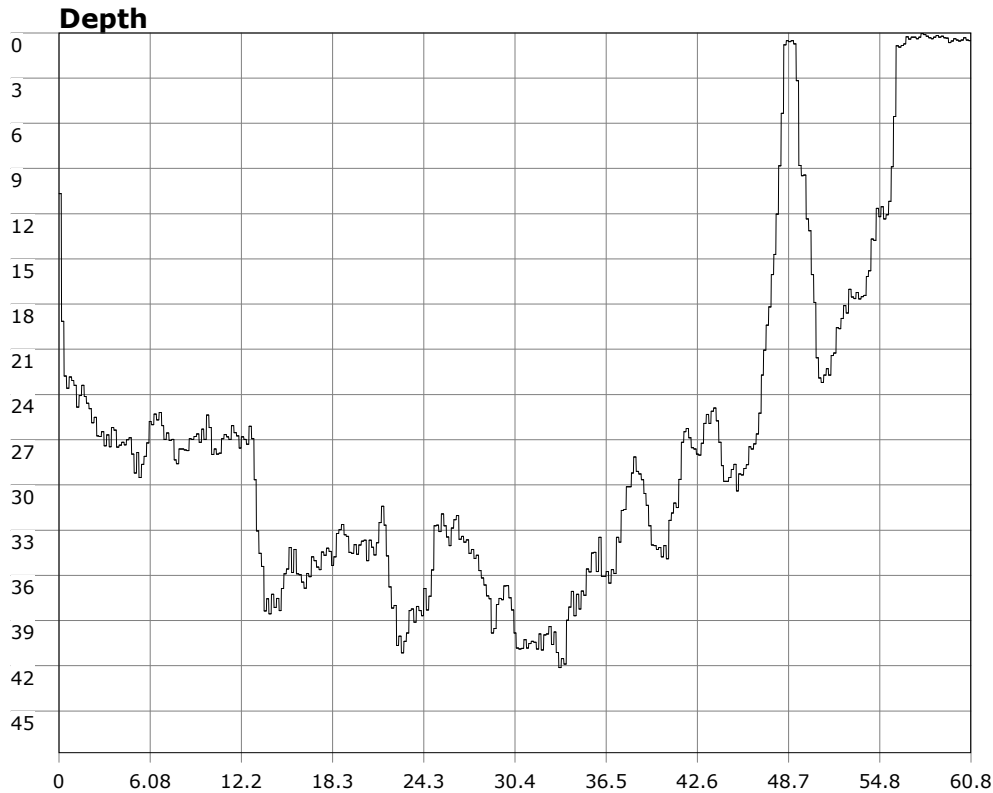

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; one light; 131lbs weight; camera with no strobe, spare air

Good dive today. Vis 5-7 feet. The air was warmer than usual, likely due to the wx front that had some dark clouds w/ a visible rain line off the coast. But I was getting wet anyway, and the water looked doable. I was the only diver in the morning which was odd.. While the fish count was a bit low, I did see several large schools of senoritas and a bait ball. Also saw a sunstar and starfish that appeared to be making out. Not sure what that's about. Entry/exit was uneventful.
