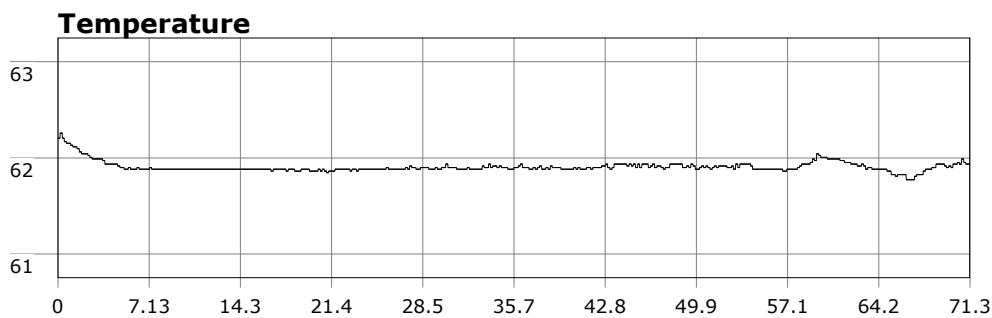
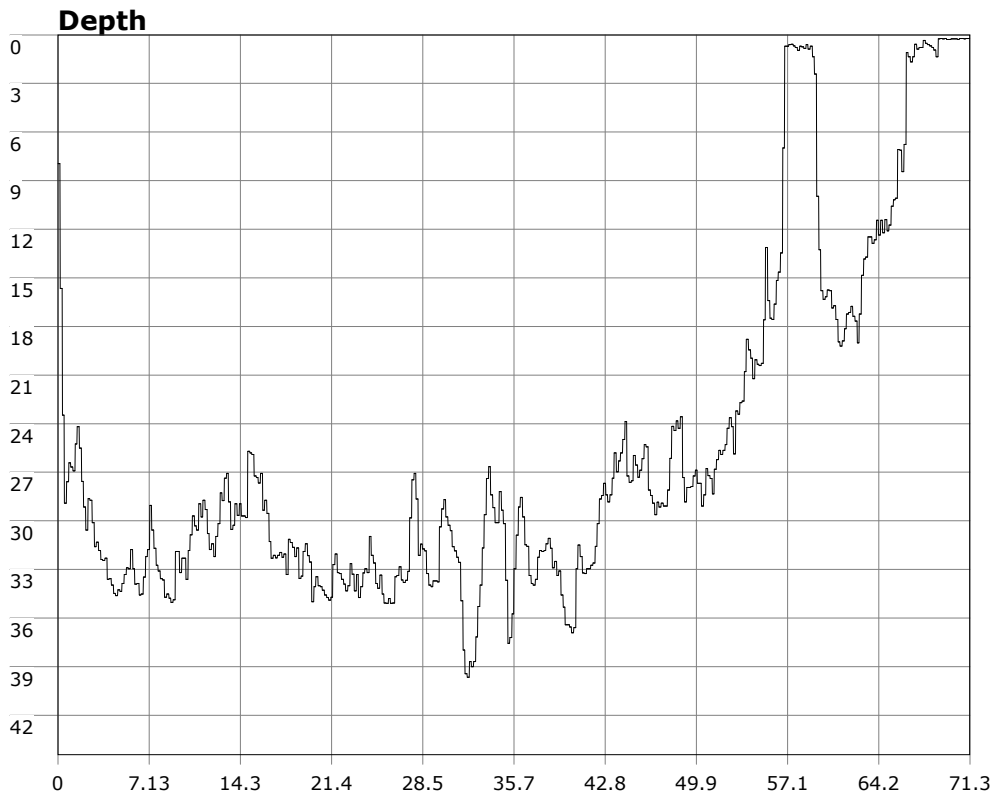

Well, for no apparent reason, vis at 120 deg reef was truly spectacular today-a consistent 25-30ft. From the cove all the way to the reef and back the sun was easily visible from the bottom. We saw plenty of octopi, male sheephead, perch, and even a short bug that let me get really close. This is the second best dive I've ever had at 120. Another set of Dive Veters got in at Long Point very early this morning and swam around the point and exited at Cardiac Hill. They were nice enough to share one of the bugs they caught so we grilled up a bug and some dogs in the parking lot (think of it as white trash turf n' surf). This was my second dive w/ the back up wet suit I've had for years. Really nice.
