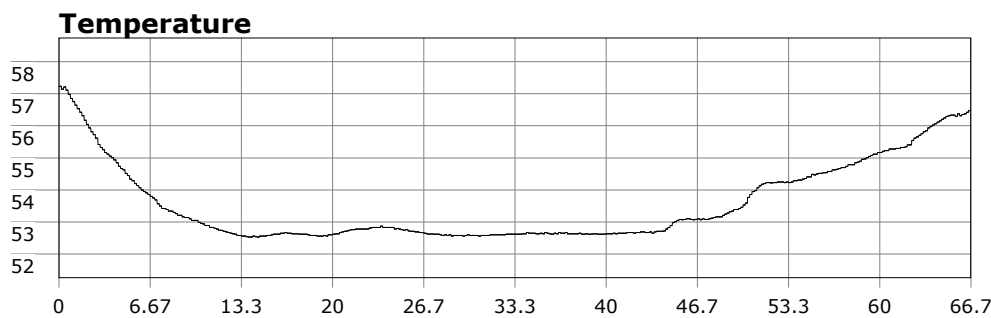

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; one light; 19 lbs weight, camera

So me, Mil Bob, and Chipper bailed on the poor vis at Malaga, ran from the surf at Christmas tree (like Dan said we would), and ended up at OML.

Best conditions in a long time today. The very westerly swell skipped on past the cove so entry/exit were very easy. Vis was 20ft and you could just see the surface from the bottom. Though not the 'dreamy' conditions from 24 Oct 09, and the water was a brisk 53deg, it was still a great dive. Well worth the 61min of bottom time.

Chipper's eagle eye spotted a big flattie very well hidden in the kelp, and there were several translucent egg sacks floating around that looked like underwater aliens.
