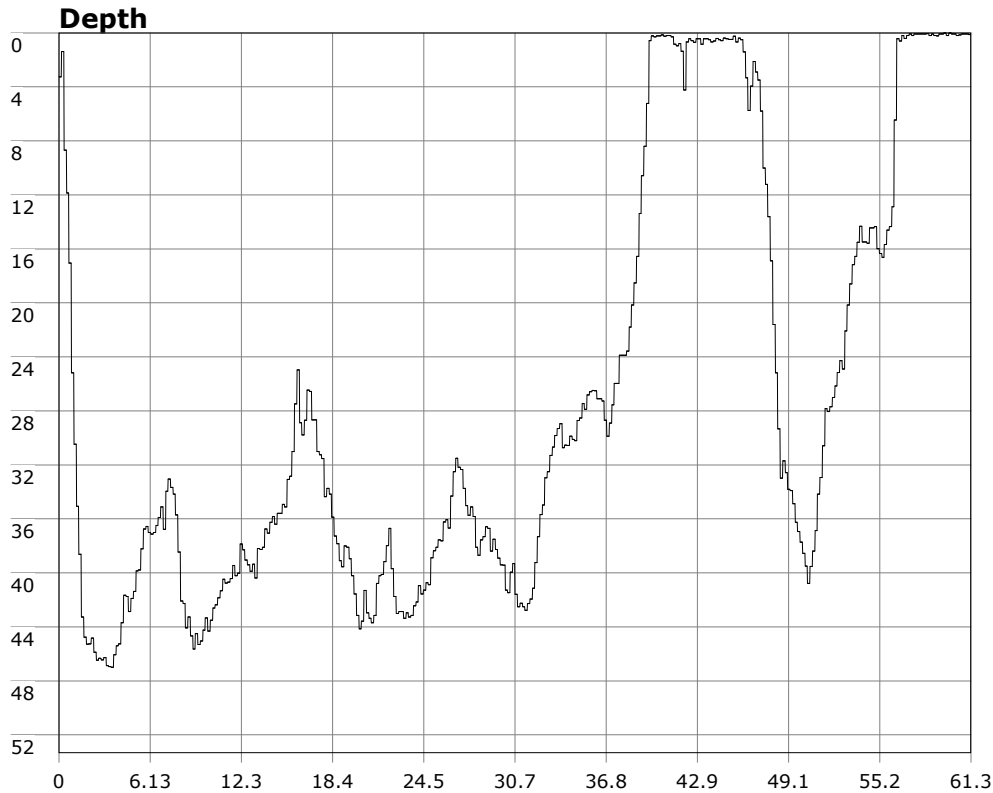

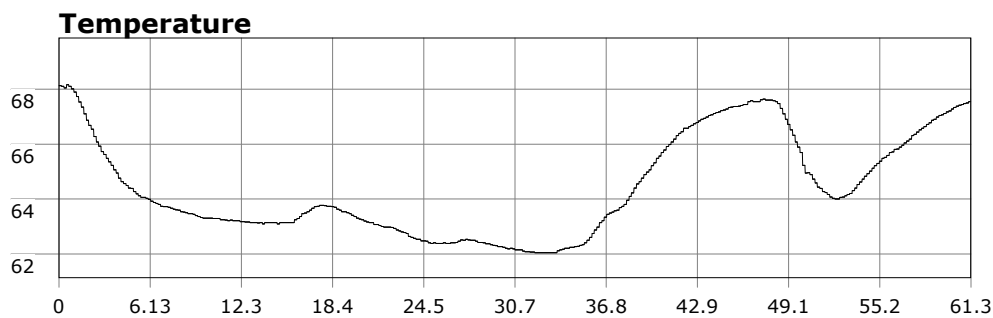

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; one light;
131lbs weight; camera with no strobe, spare air, knife

Unusual dive today at Long Point. Water looked calm enough, with the occasional wave to look out for. Was going to 120 but Jason talked me into the point. Entry was relatively uneventful. Two other divers joined us on the surface. We dropped down to do the do. Vis immediately went to near zero until about 20ft when it opened back up. But the green layer at 20ft blocked out the sun so this was essentially a night dive. Luckily no current to deal with. It was a great dive with the usual fish and other wildlife. Exit was uneventful as well. Free divers reported zero vis at 120, so good thing we hit the point.
