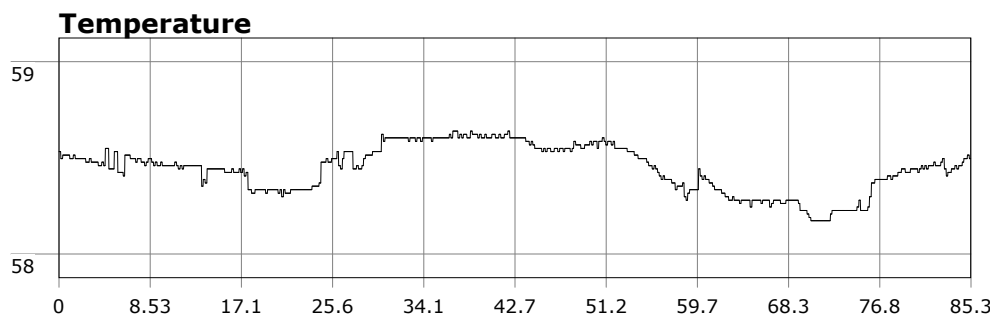
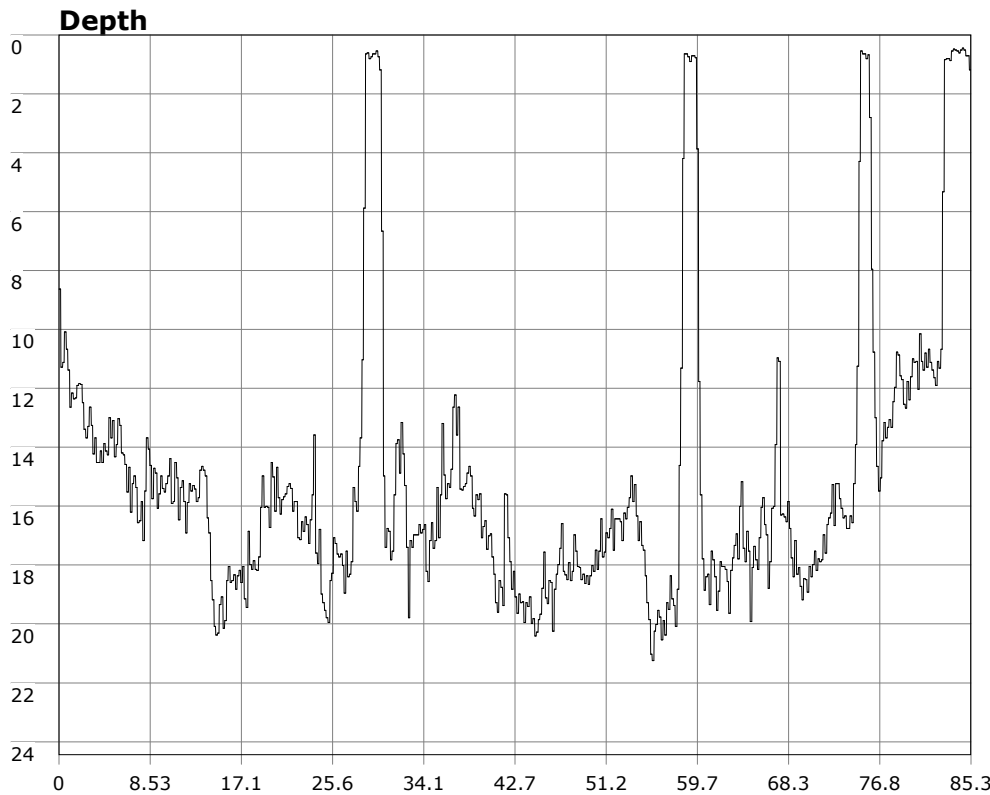

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; one light; 131lbs weight; camera with no strobe, spare air

Very good dive today. Was originally headed to CTC but when I could see rocks from the gazebo at Malaga, I called an audible and splashed in there. I entered over the rocks in front of the spa. Entry was generally easy though the occasional big roller did require some timing. I'm still amazed at how far you have to kick out just to get more than 10ft depth. I dropped down and headed west/south west for about 40 minutes then turned around. Like last week, water was calm on the surface but quite surgy on the bottom. Vis was about 8 feet, about what I had expected. Wildlife included garibaldi, large schools of small senorita, schools of what I think were barracuda, several horn sharks, and a good sized flattie. The swell seemed to pick up during the dive so I kicked all the way back to exit at the beach.
