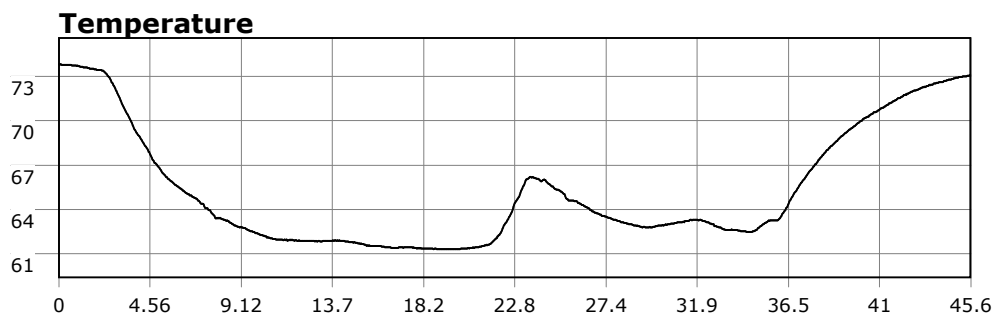

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; small light; 14lbs weight; camera and no pony bottle.

Overall a very good, lookie lou dive at Vets. Swell was higher than usual, as was forecast. The swell period was a bit tight making entry a little tougher than normal. Though not an 'advanced' beach entry, those in the classes this morning no doubt had a thrill. Given the size of the class, the instructor really earned his pay getting everyone out past the surf.

I did my usual profile here, dipping a little deeper to 50ft. Vis was hazy until about 35feet then it cleared up to my 8-10 feet threshold and made for a calm, relaxing dive. Water was cooler than on Wed with a thermocline at about 31 feet. Saw several flatties, mostly small, and a few let me get really close with the combat-cam for some video. Also saw a few hermit crabs, an octopus in a bottle (which I luckily saw before I went to pick it up as part of my trash detail), a baby horn shark, the remains of a guitarfish who had apparently had a bad day, and a blenny. I noticed less trash than normal this time--a good thing.
