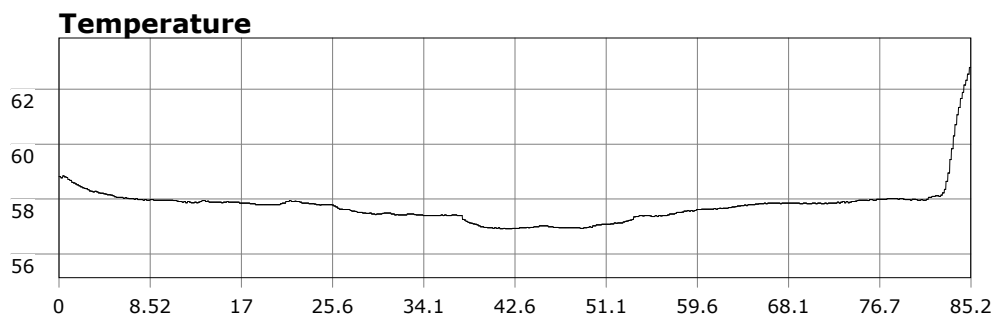

Equipment build: new 7mm suit + 7 mm vest w/hood; one light; 18 lbs weight, camera

No surprise I was 'it' at OML today. From other posts, it looks like most are sleeping off opening night hangovers.

Conditions were quite good. Topside there was sunshine, flat water, dolphins, and whales. Surf was flat. I surface kicked west towards the point and dropped. Vis was 10-12 feet but hazy enough that a light was useful. Water temp 57-58 deg. After 38 minutes I flipped around and headed back. Near the garden, vis opened up to 20+ft with the sun clearly visible from the bottom. You always know you're near the garden when the squadron of señoritas swarm in to escort you back to the cove. Bottom time was 80 minutes with 10 minutes just hanging around the garden and feeding Abby.

Saw a small octo, a 3-inch lemon dorid, and a large starfish and sunstar fighting it out. Also swam through some dark purple haze (similar to octo ink), and when I looked down to find the source I saw a sunstar wrapped around something. Not sure if it was mating, eating, or bleeding.
