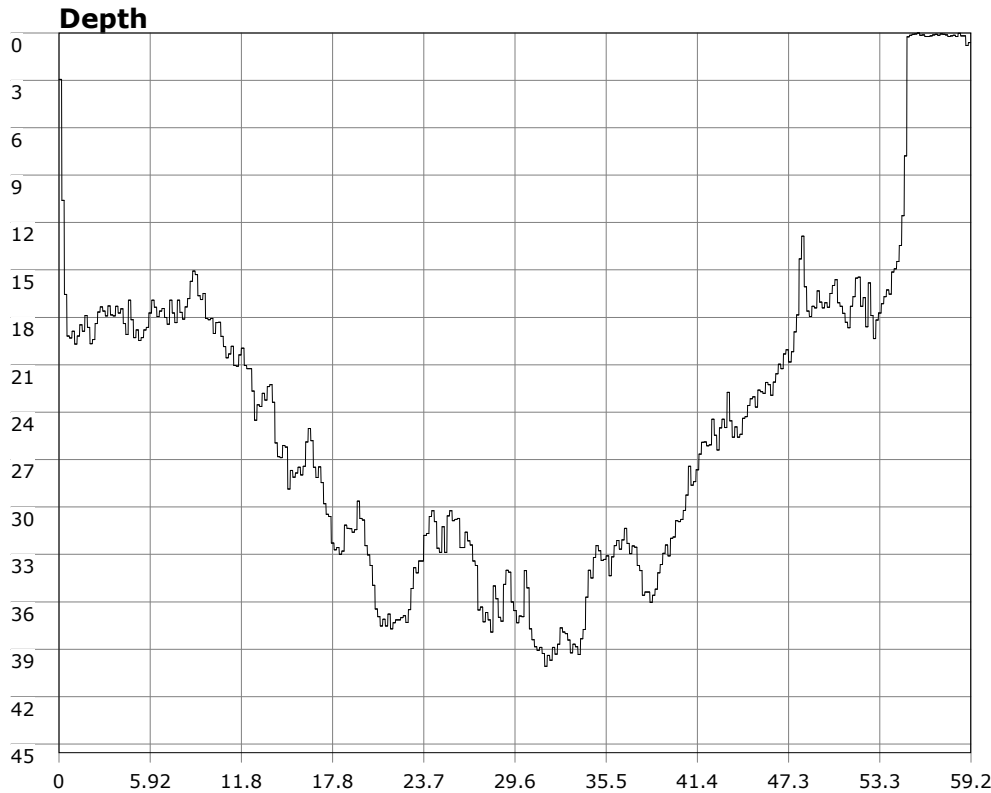

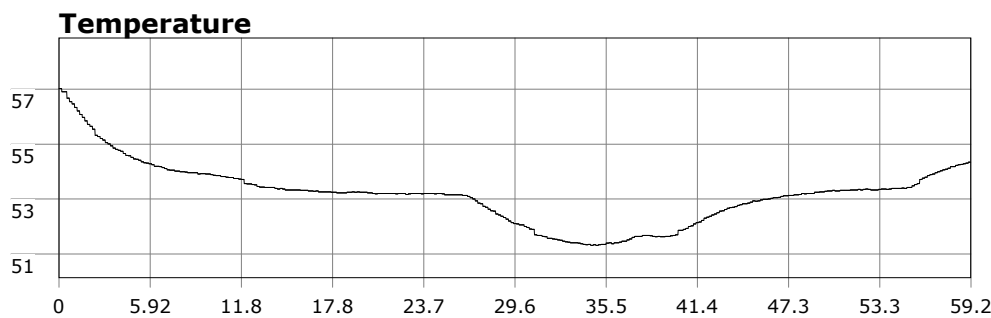

Equipment build: 7mm suit + vest w/hood; one light; 19 lbs weight, camera

Decent dive today at OML with sunny skies and relatively flat conditions. A south facing beach was definitely the way to go today. Malaga was mud, and Jake reported some tech divers got spanked in the surf at Vets.

Hooked right towards the point, and before descending I could just see past my fins from the surface. Vis at the bottom was not much better, starting at 5-6ft at first and getting to 10ft near the point. Despite the sunshine, the water was cloudy, and at 30ft you couldn't see the surface. Water temp started at 55deg but cooled down to 52deg as I kicked west. There was a slight current towards the cove.

Not much of note until I got to the pinnacles where I saw several large Hermissendas and one of the rare off-white nudibranchs. Naturally by the time I started seeing cool stuff, I was at my pre-designated turnaround time and pressure. Heading back I swam through a long cloud of what appeared to be tiny jellyfish. Since I'm actually typing this I guess they weren't box jellies
