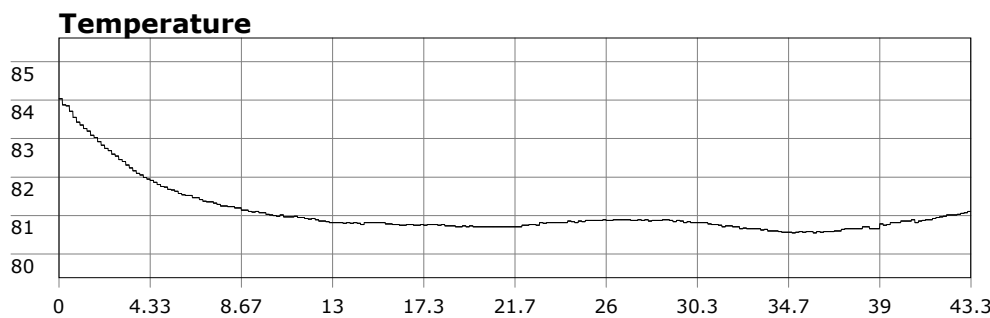
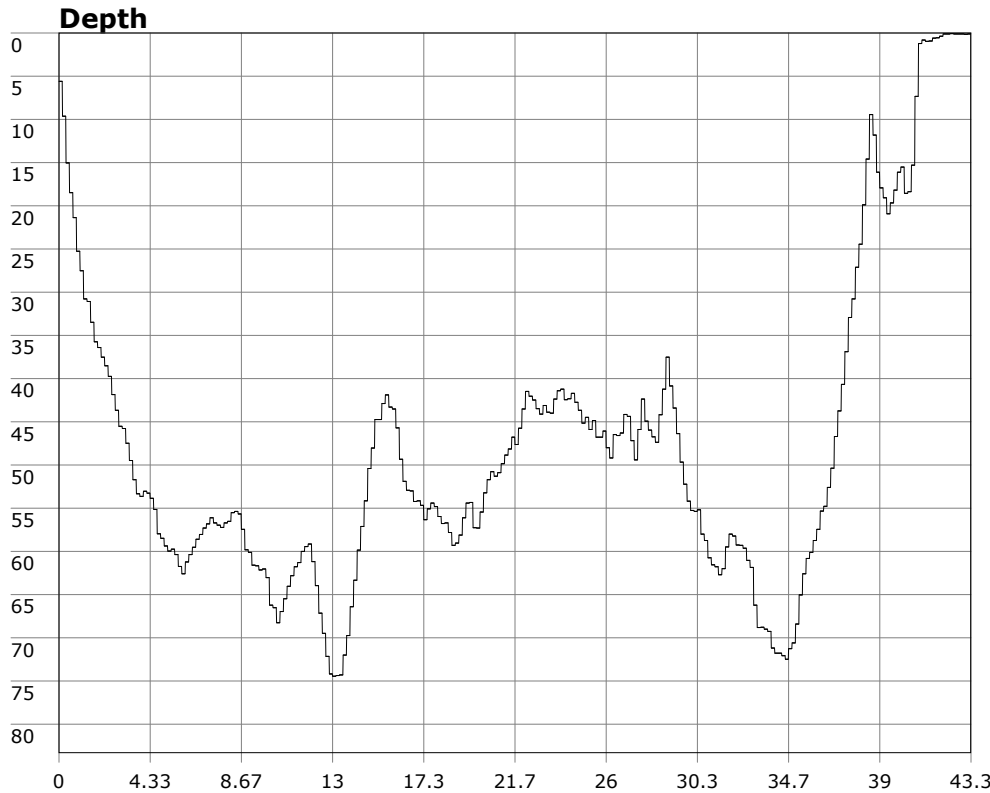

Equipment config: 3mm shortie, 9lbs weight, camera no strobe, spare air.

Highlight of this divesite are the swim throughs. We went three in total and none were very long or technical. We splashed in and descended down a big wall and kicked along the bottom to get to the mini-caves. The wall had lots of coral of all types and vis was a good 50 feet. My Brit buddy burned through his air fairly fast so he and another diver ascended to the surface. By the end it was just me and the guide. Aside from the swim throughs, the guide caught a small octopus for fun. After 10 seconds or so the octo sprayed his ink and fled the scene. Never seen that done before--kinda cool. A very good dive.
